My name is Joel Baglole, and I am submitting my curriculum vitae for the Executive Management, Government & Public Relations position that is available at the Frontier Duty Free Association in Ottawa.

Currently, I am running my own communications and government relations consulting firm called [Capital Communications](#). In my current role, I provide strategic advice to senior executives in industries ranging from high-tech to healthcare, as well as finance and media. My work for clients involves corporate communications, media relations, marketing, stakeholder outreach, social media, internal communications, government relations, crisis communications and writing and editing documents ranging from news releases to annual reports.

Previously, I worked at the Canadian Foundation for Healthcare Improvement, a federal agency that develops innovative solutions to pressing healthcare problems and spreads those innovations to provincial and territorial jurisdictions. As a Senior Communications Advisor, I supported senior management with communications that promoted the foundation's work.

Prior to that, I worked at Hill & Knowlton Strategies, the world's largest communications consulting firm, and in the public affairs department at Canada Post. At Canada Post, I was the primary communications resource during collective bargaining with the Canadian Union of Postal Workers (CUPW) and was embedded with the labour relations team during contract negotiations and subsequent shutdown of the postal system.

While attaining increasingly more responsible roles throughout my career, I have been involved in political advocacy, speech writing, crisis communications, media relations and social media. This diversity of work has given me valuable exposure to the public affairs environment and insights into the federal government.

My experience in public affairs is complemented by nearly a decade spent as a journalist for leading publications such as The Wall Street Journal and The Toronto Star newspapers. As a staff reporter for The Wall Street Journal, I wrote articles from Iceland to Indonesia and in every Canadian province. Working as a journalist has given me a wealth of knowledge about the media, and enabled me to develop superior writing and editing skills.
